Distances and walk times are per Google Maps. There may be no photography rules in some of these-check on arrival

- 1. <u>National Gallery of Ireland</u> Most attractions are free, but there are occasional exhibitions with an entry fee- check website for details, 170 metres 2 minutes' walk
- 2. **Sweny's Pharmacy** historical Joyce connection _free, 60 metres 1minute walk.
- 3. <u>Trinity College Library and Book of Kells</u>, most visited attraction in Dublin after after Guinness Tickets €18.50, 900 metres 12 minutes' walk
- 4. National Museum Archaeology Ancient Ireland free 550 metres 7-minute walk
- 5. <u>National Library of Ireland</u> 2 free exhibitions in different locations, <u>Yeats</u> 450 metres 6 minutes walk and <u>Heaney</u>, 950 metres 12 minutes walk
- 6. Museum of Literature Ireland Tickets €12, 1.1 km -14 minutes walk
- 7. <u>Little Museum of Dublin</u> Tickets €10, 800 metres 11 minutes' walk
- 8. **Saint Stephen's Green Park** free 600 metres 8 minutes walk
- 9. **Grafton Street shopping** largest store is **Brown Thomas**, 750 metres -10 minutes walk
- 10. <u>Dublin Castle</u>, 1.6 km-20 minutes' walk **State Apartments** tickets €8 booking advisable and <u>Chester Beatty Library</u> admission free
- 11. St Patrick's Cathedral, tickets €7.50, seniors over 60 €6.50, 1.9 kms 24 minutes' walk
- 12. Christchurch Cathedral tickets adult/senior €10/8.50, 1.6 kms -20 minutes' walk
- 13. **Photo Museum Ireland** (formerly Gallery of Photography Ireland) free, 1.3 kms 17 minutes' walk. Note event on 13th October
- 14. National Photographic Archive beside No 13 free, 1.3 kms 17 minutes' walk
- 15. Merrion Square Park free , 170 metres 2 minutes' walk
- 16. Oscar Wilde House guided tours €18, 79 metres 1-minute walk

National Gallery of Ireland

The Gallery is just up the road (a few minutes walk) from the Davenport Hotel and there are two entrances, on Merrion Street and on Clare Street - the latter containing access to a nice restaurant. These will be shown on a map on the first morning.

Entrance to the Gallery is free, but there is a charge of 9 or 10.80 Euros, depending on age, for the Turner 'The Sun is God' exhibition which will be a highlight and well worth seeing- booking is advised. The works are on loan from the Tate Gallery in London.
